Before the Court is Plaintiff Selective Way Insurance Company’s (“Selective”) “Motion for Default Judgment” filed on January 9, 2018. See Docket No. 28. Selective seeks default judgment on its complaint for declaratory judgment against The Glosson Group, LLC (“Glosson”). Selective served a copy of the summons and complaint on Glosson on October 30, 2017. See Docket No. 8. Such service appears to be in compliance with Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. Glosson had twenty-one (21) days from the date of service to file an answer or otherwise file a responsive motion. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(a). To date, no answer has been filed nor any appearance made on behalf of Glosson. Having failed to defend or otherwise appear, entry of default was made by the Clerk of Court against Glosson, on December 18, 2017, as required by Rule 55(a) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. See Docket No. 26.

Selective’s motion for default judgment and affidavit of Attorney Kristi K. Brownson demonstrate that Glosson has failed to appear and is not a minor, incompetent, or in military service. See Docket Nos. 28, 29, and 30. Accordingly, the Court **GRANTS** the motion for default judgment

(Docket No. 28). Pursuant to Rule 55(b), the Clerk of Court is directed to enter default judgment against Glosson and in favor of Selective as follows:

Selective Way Insurance Company has no obligation under Insurance Policy No. S 2059799, effective from February 26, 2014, to February 26, 2015, issued to The Glosson Group, LLC to defend or indemnify The Glosson Group, LLC in connection with an underlying lawsuit, Acme Electric Motor, Inc. et al. v. CSC General Contractors, Inc., et al., Civ. No. 4:15-CV-00152-BRW-CSM, (D.N.D.).

IT IS SO ORDERED.
